

- ☼ **Synopsis:** Pope Francis is acutely aware of the urgent social issues in both developing and richer nations. Climate change has emphasised that we are all in this together. Church personnel, often including Francis himself, have been consulting many leading economists, scientists, philosophers and theologians; and the Vatican is participating in international conferences on economics, peace and development in support of the UN Sustainable Development Goals. What is the Pope's strategy to mobilise world opinion to lift millions out of abject poverty, ensure greater social equity, adjust our consumer culture and address climate change? What does it mean for us in Australia?
