Many CEWA schools have embraced the Social Justice Statement through their Christian service programs. This is evident in the stories shared by two of our schools that highlight steps four, five and seven of the Ten Step resource produced to help people create a place at the table.

Trinity College

"Trinity College Annual Christian Service Assembly acknowledges senior students who have completed from 60 to over 300 hours of Christian Service in their senior years at the College. This year the focus for the Assembly was how, through Christian Service, our school community can make connections with the elderly. This is a privilege for us because they are people who have rich memories of the past to share with us and wisdom from which we can learn. Through respectful engagement with elderly people we can come to recognise them as a treasure in our society.

Christian Service Learning

At the Assembly, our prayer was based on material taken from the 2016/17 Catholic Social Justice Statement "A Place at the Table". We had two Guest Speakers from St Bartholomew's House, a local agency which houses people in difficult economic and social circumstances and has within it James Watson House for elderly people. Our Junior Choir entertained the Assembly with a song they performed for the elderly residents of RSL care as part of their Anzac Commemoration, and two Year 6 students spoke about their experience of giving service in elderly care homes. The highlight of the Assembly was the reflections shared with us by two senior students who completed their Senior Project with elderly people." - **Marya Stewart**, Director of Christian Service

Social Justice in an Ageing Society



St Mary's School Northampton

"As part of our Christian Service Learning, we believe it is our calling to assist the students to become community members who are committed to enacting the love, compassion and justice of Gospel values in their day to day lives. A close partnership has been formed between St Mary's School and the Northampton Health Service, specifically the Northampton Hospital. Our first initiative relates to our work with Meals on Wheels. Each fortnight, students from the Year 5/6 Class and a staff member, assist with the delivery of meals to the local elderly residents still living in their homes. During this service opportunity, students can see firsthand the physical assistance that members of the community may require and how much their visit means to the residents.

The second initiative is our visits to the 'Never Too Old Club'. Once a term, a class visits the members of the 'Never Too Old Club' spending an afternoon together at the Northampton Hospital. During this visit, the students may perform a song or dance, play games, draw, and converse, entertain and enjoy afternoon tea with all of the group members. The faces of the 'Never Too Old Club' members light up when the students enter the room and the room is filled with much joy, love and compassion.

Our most recent initiative is a program called Brookview Bookworms. Each Monday, a year level visits Brookview and the elderly residents of the Northampton Hospital and the students read one on one to a resident. This initiative helps the students practise their oral reading, ask and answer comprehension questions and bring a ray of sunshine to the lives of others. For the residents, it is an opportunity to engage with the younger generation, give words of encouragement and spend twenty to thirty minutes interacting with a different person in their daily lives." - **Melissa Marquis**, Principal St Mary's School


