Pope Francis Laudato Si

Pope Francis appeals to the world community to seek a sustainable and integral future (par # 13). He says “We need a conversation that includes everyone, since the environmental challenge we are undergoing and its human roots, concern and affect us all.” (par # 14)

As Catholics we are called to act in ways that are just and this involves understanding the interconnections between pressing issues of our time such as poverty, food security problems, inequities in healthcare, homelessness, human trafficking and climate change. Pope Francis reminds us “Everything is connected. Concern for the environment thus needs to be joined to a sincere love for our fellow human beings and an unwavering commitment to resolving the problems of society.” (par # 91)
