# **DISCERNING OUR "SAN DAMIANO MOMENT"**

### From the Director

**The Justice, Ecology and Development Office (JEDO) within the Catholic Archdiocese of Perth, Western Australia (WA)** recognises the opportunities within the challenges of our evolving post-pandemic world as we head toward this Holy Christmas season. As Pope Benedict XVi stated: "It is the beautiful task of Advent to awaken in all of us memories of goodness and thus to open doors of hope".

With that in mind, throughout his pontificate, Pope Francis often spoke about **discernment** in his homilies and speeches noting it's "indispensable for living" since "choices are an essential part of life". At the end of August, he launched his new catechesis series on spiritual discernment outlining the importance of **discerning God's will** and **listening to the voice of the Holy Spirit**. Pope Francis highlighted that making sound judgements requires "knowledge, experience, emotion and the will" and yet, God has given us reason and the freedom to choose. God "is always willing to advise us, to encourage us, to welcome us. But he never imposes his will. Why? Because he wants to be loved and not feared. And also, God wants children, not slaves: free children. And **love can only be lived in freedom**. To learn to live one must learn to love, and for this it is necessary to discern". The Plenary Council process also highlighted the importance of individual and then communal discernment to "listen to what the Spirit is saying". Through a listening and dialogue process for prayerful discernment, 6 key themes were initially determined in relation to the question posed: "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?". The identified themes being, (1) Missionary and Evangelising; (2) Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal; (3) Prayerful and Eucharistic; (4) Humble, Healing and Merciful; (5) A Joyful, Hope-filled and Servant Community; and (6) Open to Conversion, Renewal and Reform. Through the listening and discernment phase, and spiritual conversations of the First Assembly, features of a Christ-centred Church were identified and further explored in the Second Assembly. To further enable the process of prayerful discernment, Plenary Council President and Archbishop of Perth, the Most Reverend, Timothy Costelloe SDB, outlined 'A Journey of Discernment – The Plenary Council' in August 2020. May we now recognise the Plenary Council process as our "San Damiano moment". That is, like Francis of Assisi in the ruined chapel, being called to "go and rebuild my Church for it is falling into ruin" (A Journey of Discernment, p 6). May we now hear the call to respond to past and present pain and distress through the lens of hope to rebuild and renew our Church. As Pope Francis calls the Church to be "a healer of wounds and warmer of hearts" (A Journey of Discernment, p 10), our shared journey of healing is ongoing... so, let us begin anew.

### **MIGRANTS & REFUGEES**

The 2022 theme chosen by Pope Francis for the World Day of Migrants & Refugees (held in September) was **Building the Future** with Migrants & Refugees. His Holiness stated: "No one must be excluded. God's plan is essentially inclusive and gives priority to those living on the existential peripheries. Among them are many migrants and refugees, displaced persons, and victims of trafficking. The Kingdom of God is to be built with them, for without them it would not be the Kingdom that God wants. The inclusion of those most vulnerable is the necessary condition for full citizenship in God's Kingdom. Indeed, the Lord says, "...For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me a drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me" (Mt 25:34-36).

With this in mind, on the 1<sup>st</sup> of August 2022, the St Vincent de Paul Society in Australia welcomed the introduction of legislation in Parliament to **end indefinite and arbitrary detention of refugees**. This has been an important advocacy issue for many years for the ACBC: the Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference as noted in the call for action from Bishop Long in 2019.

### **Season of Creation** (1st September to 4th October)

The 1st of September is the World Day of Prayer for Creation and the beginning of the Season of Creation. This goes through to the 4th of October, the Feast Day of St Francis of Assisi. Given September is springtime in Australia, the timing for the Season of Creation works well. However, there are opportunities for the global Laudato Si' Action Goals to be given more attention. This is not only in the context of CoP 27 - the Council of Parties gathering in Egypt for the UN Climate Change Conference; but also recognising that the Bishops of Oceania are due to meet in Suva, Fiji in February

2023 where the vulnerability of neighbouring island nations can speak to their lived experiences and witnessing of current climate disasters. It's worth highlighting that the Second Assembly of the Plenary Council included the theme: Integral Ecology and Conversion for the sake of our Common Home. These are further supported by the 2021/22 Social Justice Statement from our national bishops: 'Cry of the Earth. Cry of the Poor' which are influenced by the urgent call to prayerful discernment and action from Pope Francis in Laudato Si' - On Care for Our Common Home (2015).



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# **Social Justice Action**

### Senate Inquiry on Poverty – Open for Submissions

A Senate Inquiry into 'The extent and nature of poverty in Australia' is open for submissions until 3 February 2023 and will table its report in October next year. The inquiry will examine: the rates and drivers of poverty in Australia; the relationship between economic conditions (including fiscal policy, rising inflation and cost of living pressures) and poverty; the impact of poverty on individuals in relation to: employment outcomes, housing security, health outcomes, and education outcomes; the impacts of poverty amongst different demographics and communities; the relationship between income support payments and poverty and mechanisms to address and reduce poverty.

According to the *Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church* (#193), solidarity is a social principle and a moral virtue in the sphere of justice through

serving others as opposed to exploiting them, because we are all responsible for all.

As St Pope John Paul 11 stated: "Solidarity is not a feeling of vague compassion or shallow distress at the misfortunes of so many people, both near and far. On the contrary, it is a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good; that is to say to the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all" "
